The 4 Principles of Teaching & Learning at MACS

Miles Ahead is held up by four principles within it's instructional design.

Whole Child Approach:

MACS believes that academic success is built on strong character qualities of respect, collaboration, perseverance, responsibility, and compassion. To lay the foundation for academic success, MACS will foster and celebrate scholars' character development by building a culture in which scholars and staff work together to become effective learners and ethical people who contribute to a better world.

Student Growth and Achievement:

At MACS, we quantify mastery as both standards-based proficiency and individual growth across disciplines over time. No two scholars start the school year in the same place; thus, MACS prioritizes the need to ensure scholars are receiving academic content that is equitable for their individual pathway and prepares them for success at each level of their education. Supporting the balance of growth and achievement across disciplines are the scholar-engaged assessment practices that position scholars to be leaders of their own learning.

A Purpose Driven Learning Environment: A quality education can change the course of a young child's life. Knowing that, we take deliberate steps to ensure that the school, classroom and school climate promote both joy and rigor. The success of a school begins with the environment set within the walls of a classroom, hallways, common areas, and appearance of the entire facility and is manifested by the well-being of its community.

Community: Families and community members are key partners in the education of children. At MACS, staff members make families welcome, value their contributions and backgrounds, and engage them actively in the life of the school. Leaders and teachers explicitly recognize that families care about their children's education, bring strengths, and add value to the community.

FAQS

What grade levels will MACS offer for the 2024-2025 school year?

- MACS will offer grades K-5 for the 2024-2025 school. We will grow an additional grade each year until we are a full capacity of K-8.

Even if I don't live in Cobb County, my child (ren) can still attend MACS?

- Absolutely! We are a state-commission charter school (SCSC) this means that we have a statewide attendance zone.

Does MACS provide transportation?

- MACS provides satellite bus transportation with limited seating. Please indicate on your application that you are interested in our Satellite bus transportation.

Does MACS provide meals?

- Yes! MACS serves breakfast, lunch, and snacks at a cost. Scholars are also welcome to bring their own lunches as well as refillable water bottles – if they so choose.

Does my scholar have to wear uniforms?

- Miles Ahead is a uniform school and observes uniform dress Mon-Thurs and spirit wear Fridays. Each scholar will receive a FREE polo and t-shirt from MACS in their “Welcome to the CREW” welcome package upon enrollment. Parents will be able to order additional uniform apparel directly from our vendor – Brand Evolution.

Does MACS offer before/after-care?

- YES! MACS does offer before & after-care daily. Before care operates from 6:40am – 7:30am and aftercare operates from 3:00pm – 6:00pm. The weekly rate for before care is \$25/week and \$65/week for aftercare. We do observe a 10% sibling discount.

What about siblings who are not in K-5th? Will you accept them?

We will grow to be a K-8 campus, however, for the 2024-2025 school year MACS will have grades K-5th. This means that we can not enroll grades 6th - 8th.

What if one of my scholars gets in and the other one (s) doesn't?

- Unfortunately, we do not observe sibling priority for scholars that are not currently enrolled. There is a possibility that you may have one or more scholars on the waitlist.

What is the cut-off age for Kindergarten enrollment?

- Kindergarten scholars must be 5 years old before September 1st, 2024, to be eligible to enroll in Kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year. There are no exceptions to this policy.

What is the cut-off age for First Grade enrollment?

- First-grade scholars must be 6 years old before September 1st, 2024, to be eligible to enroll in Kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year. There are no exceptions to this policy.

How do I apply?

- **Online** - Our online application is through SchoolMint. SchoolMint allows families to use the web and their iOS or Android phones and devices to submit applications, check application status, and take the next steps in the enrollment process.
- **Paper-based** - You may print the application via our website, complete all sections, upload the document, & email it to: enroll@milesaheadcharter.org. You will receive confirmation via email.

What happens once I am notified that my child (ren) has been granted an available seat?

- You can begin completing your registration requirements. Registration must be completed by the deadline of June 30th.



FAQS

Is anyone given preference in the enrollment process?

- Yes. Scholars that have siblings that are currently enrolled are given preference.

Will my scholar have to participate in the lottery each year?

- No. Once your scholar is officially enrolled, they will remain in an enrolled status unless they are withdrawn by their parent/guardian.

Whom can I contact to discuss questions related to enrollment or to receive assistance with enrollment?

If my desired tour date is booked, can I walk-in for a tour?

- No. MACS does not facilitate walk-in/walk-up tours. Our tour schedule is intentionally designed to fit the needs & safety of our current scholars & staff.

What are the documents required to complete my application?

- Parent/Guardian ID
- Birth Certificate
- Proof of Residence
- Social Security Card

Why does the school require the submission of a birth certificate?

- We are required by the GA Dept. of Education to verify the date of birth as part of the eligibility process for enrollment.

Why does the school require the submission of the SSN?

- The Georgia Department of Education generates a GTID for all public school scholars. This is the identification number that is used for all school-related documents and reporting. If your child has never been enrolled in a Georgia public pre-k or public school we will request the social security number as this is what allows this alternate ID to be generated. **(No child will be denied enrollment or attendance to MACS for declining to provide an ss card. Families may waive the requirement to provide an ss card.)**

What are acceptable forms for Proof of Residence?

- Mortgage/Lease Statement
- GA Power or Electric Bill
- Vehicle Registration
- Water or Sewage Bill
- Renter's Insurance
- **W2/Tax Document**

If my scholar & I are currently living with family or friends, are we required to submit residency documentation?

- Yes. We will ask that you submit documentation for the address that you are currently residing in along with a notarized affidavit of residency.

What is required to actually register my scholar once I have received seat acceptance?

- Completion of the registration sections 1-11 on SchoolMint
- Form 3300 (Ear, Eye, Dental, Nutrition) all sections should be signed/dated by a licensed physician
- Form 3231 (Immunization) or a notarized waiver (Form 2208)

What are the exemptions for Form 3231?

- Medical exemption authorized by a medical doctor. This must be indicated on Form 3231, a letter is not sufficient. Medical exemptions must be kept on file, are valid for one year, and may be reissued from year to year until a physician determines immunizations can be completed.
- Conflict with religious beliefs verified by parents'/legal guardians' sworn affidavit. The only affidavit that may be used to register a religious objection to required vaccinations is DPH Form 2208. The form must be notarized and can be accessed on our school website or by emailing: enroll@milesaheadcharter.org

What is the registration deadline for the 24-25 school year?

- June 30th, 2024

What if my scholar's doctor's appointments are scheduled for after June 30th?

- We strongly encourage you to try to set your appointments ahead of the deadline. In order to be considered for an extension, we require documentation of a confirmed/scheduled upcoming appointment.

What are some programs that MACS will offer my child (ren)?

- MACS offers a curriculum focused on 21st century skills and digital citizenship to help our scholars be prepared for their futures. These programs include learning coding as a language, responsible social media usage curriculum, responsible internet usage, and integrated units on computer science. Our goal is to equip scholars with the skills they would need to be prepared for a digitally interconnected society

What is the “Whole Child Approach?”

- Whole Child Approach is the belief that the needs of the scholar are at the center of all decisions driving MACS. The master schedule, routines, strategic goals, everything starts with the needs of our scholars, and then we build structures of support around those needs. For example, we start and end everyday with Crew time as a way for scholars to set goals, and reflect on how they day went. In other words, it is the belief that a school should give more than an academic foundation to kids, but that we should equip them to lead whole, healthy, happy lives.

How is “whole child approach” used at MACS?

- Daily and through all decisions. While more than an hour per day is dedicated to focused social emotional learning through our morning and afternoon CREW meetings, a whole child perspective comes into focus as we consider all decisions ranging from academics to discipline to nutrition. We prioritize what is best for the growth of a scholar over a bottom line. At MACS, all faculty and staff are given more than 10 hours of annual training on whole child support, and leverage this training in their approach with students daily.

What is EL Education and how is it used at MACS?

- EL Education has a specific school design model that has had success in diverse communities. EL Education was selected as the top curriculum model in 2018, has over 25 years of experience developing school design, and is currently in place at several successful metro Atlanta schools. Prior to the launching of MACS, founding team members shadowed and studied best practices at many local and nationally recognized EL schools to establish strong foundations of teaching and learning at MACS. MACS uses EL Education to support our Literacy instruction.

What other curriculum resources does MACS use to support instruction

- HMH Math, StemScopes, Social Studies Weekly, & a number of digital platforms are used to support instruction at MACS.

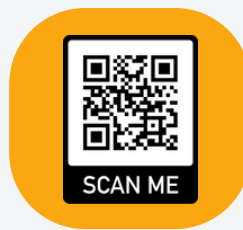
